To the Honorable, the City Council,
of the City of Cambridge,

The undersigned respectfully ~~present~~ respectfully represent that when Grigg Street was laid out and accepted by the city as a public way, to a point near Putnam Avenue, a strip of land 5 feet wide and 66 ³⁷ feet long in front of land of Kelley & McKinnon, was reserved by ^{your petitioners} the sheet being but 35 feet wide in front of said land. The said strip so reserved, is of no use to the undersigned, and valuable only for sheet purposes. In order to make the said Grigg sheet of the uniform width of forty feet, the undersigned hereby tender to the city a deed of release of the strip aforesaid, the same containing, Three Hundred and thirty one ⁸⁵ square feet more or less, and pray that the same may be accepted and made a part of said Grigg sheet.
