The Traffic Department conducted a postcard survey of all the residents of Salem Street asking them in which direction they preferred Salem to be made one way. The results were that 8 residents wanted the street left as is, which is one way from Auburn Street to Watson Street and 5 residents wanted it made one way from Watson Street to Auburn Street.

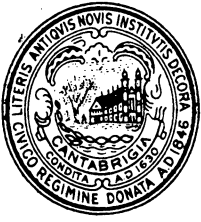
It was our intention to serve as many persons as possible on this street and that was the reason we made it one way from Auburn Street to Watson Street.

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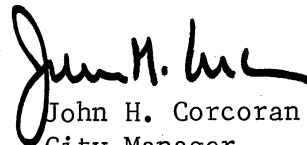
