WHEREAS: Lead-Safe Cambridge is a new lead paint abatement and poisoning prevention program sponsored by the City and funded by the United States Department of Housing and Urban Development; and

WHEREAS: Lead-Safe Cambridge enables eligible property owners to receive funding for lead abatement minimizes the environmental health risk of lead paint to Cambridge children and ensures access to affordable housing for low and moderate income families with children under the age of six; now therefore be it
