out three new streets through his land in
Hard One, and believes them to be of the
width and description requisite for accep-
tance by your Honorable Board.

The first of these proposed streets runs from
Wth Auburn Street South Easterly, and parallel
with Putnam Street, about seven hundred
feet. The 2nd & 3rd of the proposed streets run
from the 1st street to De Wolf Street, and are
respectively about 600 & 650 feet in length,
as will appear from the sketch submitted
herewith.

Your Petitioner therefore prays that said pro-
posed streets be accepted by the City of
Cambridge as Highways.
