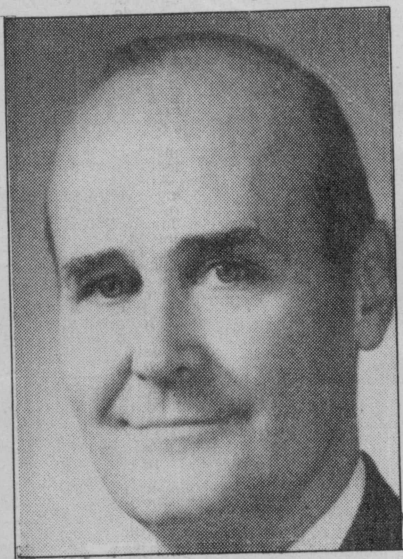

Dr. Garrett Sullivan, 86

Retired ophthalmologist

Dr. Garrett L. Sullivan 2d of Needham and Duxbury, an ophthalmologist at Massachusetts Eye and Ear Infirmary for 50 years, died Wednesday in Newton-Wellesley Hospital. He was 86.

Dr. Sullivan was born in Cambridge. He graduated from Boston College and Harvard Medical School and served in the Army during World War II.

A former director of the Boston Eye Bank and president of the New England Ophthalmological Society, he was a member of the staff at the Carroll Center for the Blind and a consultant to the Veterans Administration Hospital in West Roxbury. He taught at Harvard Medical School for many years.

He enjoyed playing golf and tennis and was a member of the Longwood Tennis Club and the Charles River and Marshfield country clubs and the Bostonian Society.

He leaves his wife, Rosemary (Keefe); three daughters, Jean Pybas of Douglas, Rosmary Avery of Sherborn and Nancy Brunette of Marco Island, Fla; and four grandchildren.

A funeral Mass will be said at 10 a.m. tomorrow in St. Paul's Church in Wellesley. Burial will be in St. Patrick's Cemetery in Natick.
