WHEREAS:-

This City Council has been concerned with the problem of providing police protection and security for the residents of the housing developments operated by the Cambridge Housing Authority, and

WHEREAS:-

The Cambridge Housing Authority which is under the jurisdiction of the Department of Community Affairs of the Commonwealth has been unable to secure a budget appropriation to provide for policemen in housing developments and all efforts with HUD and other Federal agencies have produced no affirmative solution to the security problems of the residents of the housing developments, and

WHEREAS:-

The State and Federal agencies concerned with this problem have indicated by their actions that local police should be provided to cope with this problem, therefore be it

ORDERED:-

That the City Manager be and hereby is requested to order the Chief of Police to assign the necessary patrolmen to all housing developments in the City of Cambridge on a twenty-four hour basis in order to provide the residents of the housing developments with the same police protection accorded to all the citizens of the City of Cambridge, and be it further

ORDERED:-

That the Chief of Police and the Cambridge Housing Authority work together to secure Federal funds for police protection in housing developments and on the street.
