- ORDERED: That this City Council go on record extending its appreciation and gratitude for the address delivered by the Honorable Tokuma Utsonomiya, Member of the House of Councillors of the National Diet of Japan, to the City Council at its regular meeting of May 10, 1982, which provided an insight into the experience of the Japanese people resulting from atomic warfare and stressed their commitment to the solution of world problems through a strengthened United Nations, rather than a continued reliance on deterrent by nuclear arms; and be it further
- ORDERED: That this City Council reaffirms its opposition to any form of nuclear warfare and joins with the Honorable Tokuma Utsonomiya, in calling for a freeze on the future use of nuclear arms; and be it further
- ORDERED: That the remarks of the Honorable Tokuma Utsonomiya be entered into the permanent records of this City Council to record our admiration and gratitude for this messenger of peace in a turbulent world, where human life is threatened by the ever-present threat of nuclear warfare; and be it further
- ORDERED: That the City Clerk be and hereby is requested to forward a suitably engrossed copy of this resolution to the Honorable Tokuma Utsonomiya on behalf of the entire City Council.
