WHEREAS: The Little Orchestra of Cambridge was founded on April 18, 1975 by Harriet Fierman, Gertrude Spiller and Rachel Spiller; and

WHEREAS: The orchestra has been the community orchestra in Cambridge for eighteen years, open to all musicians without audition; and

WHEREAS: The orchestra has presented well over one hundred free concerts throughout Cambridge in Community Schools, elderly housing, hospitals, libraries and community centers; and

WHEREAS: The orchestra has worked in close association with the Cambridge Public Schools Music Department and the Cambridge Public Library Children's Rooms to foster an appreciation for classical music; and

WHEREAS: Under the direction of Music Director, Adam Grossman, the Little Orchestra of Cambridge has expanded to include chamber music programs to perform in smaller sites throughout Cambridge; and

WHEREAS: Among its goals, the orchestra supports the work of local composers and soloists, including many from within the orchestra, and fosters community outreach; now therefore be it

RESOLVED: That this City Council sends its warmest congratulations to the Little Orchestra on the completion of their very successful eighteenth season and thus proclaims May 21, 1993 as Little Orchestra of Cambridge Day in Cambridge; and be it further

RESOLVED: That the City Clerk is hereby requested to prepare a suitably engrossed copy of this resolution for presentation to Rachel Spiller, Co-founder and President of the Little Orchestra of Cambridge.
