Stewart was eventually picked to serve with the Office of Strategies Services (O.S.S.) as a security intelligence agent in Italy during World War II. He was a recipient of several medals, including the good conduct medal, European African Middle Eastern Theater Ribbon, World War II Victory Ribbon and Army of Occupation Medal (Italy) and also aided in the capture of the German war criminal Anton Dossler who was responsible for the murder of 12 O.S.S. agents. After an honorable discharge from the military in 1946, he went on to a devoted 26-year career with the Metropolitan District Police. After his retirement from the M.D.C., Francis spent the next eight years with the M.I.T. campus police department.

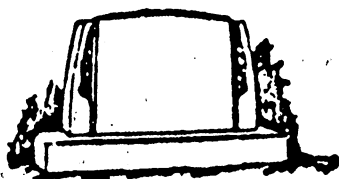
In 1958, Louis served the Mt. Moriah Lodge and Worthy Patron chapter & Order of Prince Hall Jurisdiction.
