WHEREAS: The Federal Preservation (Title VI) Program has run out of funding for Fiscal Year 1996; and

WHEREAS: 808-812 Memorial Drive and Alewife Parkway Apartments have approved Plans of Action from HUD to be permanently preserved as affordable low and moderate income housing, but there is no more money available for fiscal year 1996 to fund these sales to non-profit owners; and

WHEREAS: There is a need for funding for tenant-based vouchers to be available for tenants who may be displaced as a result of prepayment; and

WHEREAS: \$900 million is needed for the Preservation Program to fund for sales to non-profits and tenant-based vouchers; now therefore be it

RESOLVED: That the Cambridge City Council go on record urging Representative Joseph Kennedy II, Senator John Kerry and Senator Edward Kennedy to support the continuation of the Preservation Program at \$900 million in the FY '97 HUD Appropriations Bill; and be it further

RESOLVED: That the City Clerk be and hereby is requested to forward a suitably engrossed copy of this resolution to Representative Kennedy, Senator Kerry, and Senator Kennedy on behalf of the entire City Council.

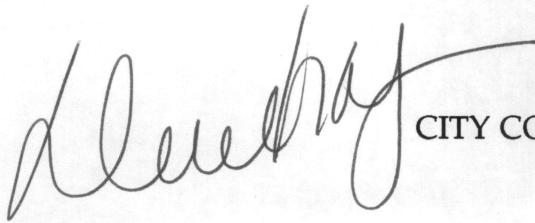
