That His Honor the Mayor be and hereby is authorized to execute a lease between the City of Cambridge and the Cambridge Community Center, the same providing for the occupancy by the Cambridge Community Center of the old Tarbell School property on Howard, Grigg and Magee Streets for a period of five years from November 1933 at an annual rental of One Dollar (\$1). And it is further

ORDERED:-

That the City of Cambridge may terminate the aforesaid lease by notifying the Cambridge Community Center three months in advance of the date they desire a return of said property,

We are writing you in behalf of the Cambridge Community Center at 49 Howard Street, Cambridge.
