- WHEREAS: Traffic and parking congestion on Huron Avenue between Concord Avenue and Fresh Pond has continued to increase, especially at the three shopping areas within that area; and
- WHEREAS: Double parking and illegal parking causes hazardous conditions and rampant ticketing, frustrating residents, shoppers, and business people alike; and
- WHEREAS: The Traffic Department did do a study of this area two years ago, finding conditions that need correcting; therefore, it is hereby
- ORDERED: That the City Manager is requested to have the Traffic and Police Departments work on creative, long-term responses to these conditions; and be it further
- ORDERED: In doing so, they work closely with community residents and business people to work out competing desires and demands; and be it further
- ORDERED: That various issues including the possibility of angle parking, where feasible, meters, location of bus stops and loading zones, additional traffic lights to cut down on speed, be worked through in order that these difficult conditions be alleviated.
