Traffic Board Meeting, May 25, 1977.

Present: Chairman Vincent Panico, Lt. Joseph Borelli, Deputy Chief Gelinas, Conrad Fagone, John Pitkin, Richard Easler, George Teso, Lauren Preston and David Bryant.

1. School Dept.

The Dept. met with Mr. Saterial of the School Dept. concerning their parking problems. The outcome was that they would make a study to determine how many parking spaces they have or who used them. Once this is known the Traffic Department will work with them to find a solution.

2. Accidents:

The City has had 7 fatal accidents this fiscal year. Most have occurred between the hours of 4:30PM and 2:00AM and about half of these accidents involved alcohol. The Police Dept. has had an increase of over 100% in the number of citations issued for moving violations during the past month. The enforcement index accepted nation-wide is 20.1 (this is arrived at by dividing the number of deaths and injuries by the number of citations issued). Due to the bad winter, Jan., Feb. and Mar. we were well below the accepted figure. With this increased enforcement, the enforcement index in Cambridge will soon be at an acceptable figure.

3. Tow & Hold:

We have already collected \$20,000.00 and Lt. Borelli reports that many delinquent violators are calling his office to find out how much they owe, in fear that they may be towed. At the present we are only looking for cars that owe over \$100.00 in unpaid fines. We expect to have a total of 25 Parking Control Officers on the streets by the end of July.

4. Middlesex Court Parking:

The same conditions exist today as they did a year ago. Mr. Teso has offered to meet with them but they have never set up a meeting. Lechemere Sales is starting to tow cars from their parking lot that are not customers which may help bring this matter to a head.

5. Hospital Parking Lot:

The Line Street Lot will have 100 parking spaces nightly for nearby residents to use at .50 per night.

6. Visitor Permits:

We know Visitor Permits are being abused and that residents give them to their friends to use. Our Parking Control Officers check numbers but we must rely mostly on complaints from citizens.

7. Vincent Panico and John Pitkin and George Teso reviewed requests for Visitor Parking Permits.
