To all City of Cambridge Department Heads: Greetings! We have made a decision to observe Bring Your Child to Work Day on Thursday, April 27.

The City Manager will allow employees to bring a child, age 9-15, to work for the day, with their supervisor's and/or department head's permission. A child much younger than 9 would not get the benefit of what this day is supposed to be about. However, supervisors can use judgement on allowing a 7 or 8-year olds to come in with their parent. Employees may ask to bring in a grandchild, godchild or other type of close relation and this can be allowed.

Although we realize that the nationally recognized day is National Bring Your Daughter to Work Day, developed by the Ms. Foundation to encourage self esteem, boost confidence and expose young girls to various career opportunities, we believe it should be open to boys and girls.

This year's theme is "Free To Be You and Me" and urges workplaces to create activities that encourage girls (in our case, boys too) to think about diversity and gender equity in the new millennium.

Due to the short turnaround time, there may not be much formal programming but we would like to urge departments to consider coordinating their own activities. The Women's Commission may hold a program for girls and we are waiting to see if the Mayor's office can host something in the afternoon.

We will be sending a PIO update out on this event and ask each of you to designate a person in your office to copy and distribute that e-mail to all employees.
