IN CITY COUNCIL

April 30, 1979

ORDERED:

That in accordance with the provisions of the General Ordinances of the City of Cambridge, Chapter 3, Section 3-2, the Commissioner of Public Works be and hereby is authorized to grant a permit to the HARVARD SQUARE FLEA MARKET for the purpose of displaying and selling merchandise on the sidewalk in front of the property of the First Parish in Cambridge on Church Street and Massachusetts Avenue on Saturdays up to and including October 31, 1979 from 9 a.m. to 6 p.m. provided that no such permit shall be granted to exceed more than twenty-five percent of the width of the sidewalk from the property line of the premises in front of which said display shall be installed and providing further that before erecting the above named display, the petitioner shall file with the City Clerk a satisfactory bond in the sum of Two Thousand Dollars (\$2,000) conditioned to save harmless the City of Cambridge from all claims for damages arising from the construction, maintenance and use of said display.

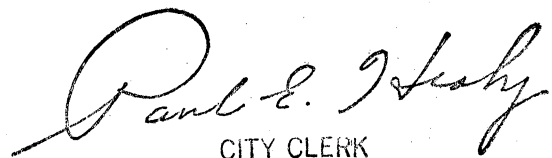

To the Cambridge City Council:

Further information regarding the Harvard Square Flea Market application for permit.

As we enter our third year of operation, the Flea Market is again preparing to move outside, subject to your approval. We have met with representatives of the Harvard Square Business Association and the Cambridge Arts Council. In the course of these meetings we have agreed on a number of policies and guidelines for outdoor operation, including the following:

There shall be a policeman or security officer on duty at the Market.

There shall be no on-street parking by the Market, or by persons assisting or selling at the Market.

The Cambridge Arts Council shall be consulted regarding questions of aesthetics and design.

Tables will not be permitted to occupy more than the space allotted by the permit.
