WHEREAS, in the opinion of the Board, the public safety and convenience require that Lakeview Avenue, from Brattle street to Vessel Lane, and Lexington Avenue, from Brattle street, parallel with said Lakeview Avenue, should be laid out as public streets, forty feet in width,—and that a new street should be laid out fifty feet in width, in extension of Portland street, and parallel with the Boston and Albany Railroad, from Main street to Fort Washington,—

ORDERED, That due notice be given to the owners of the land over which it is proposed to lay out said streets, and all other persons interested, that this Board intends to lay out the streets before mentioned, by taking a portion of their land and laying out the same as public streets—and that
