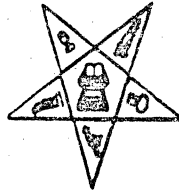

CHARLES F. COX 33rd Resume'

Born and raised in Cambridge, Massachusetts. Attended and graduated from the Houghton Elementary School, now named The Martin Luther King School and the Cambridge High and Latin School, where I received a Scholarship to the New England Conservatory of Music.

While studying at the New England Conservatory of Music, I attended the Faust School of Piano Tuning and graduated with skills that qualified me a Piano Technician.

Graduated from the New England Conservatory of Music with a Teachers Diploma. In 1950 I joined the Prince Hall Family and became a member of Celestial Lodge NO.2, at 1095 Tremont St. Boston, Mass.

In 1966 I entered the Boston Conservatory of Music and was accepted a member in the Kappa Gamma Psi Fraternity. Graduated from the Boston Conservatory of Music with a Bachelors Degree in Music Education.

After traveling extensively with Bands and Shows I re-instated into the Prince Hall Family in 1969

The year 1970 was indeed a banner year for me.

1. Elected First Administrative Vice President of the Boston Musicians Association, Local 9-535

2. Elected delegate to the National Convention of Musicians for four years
3. Arched into St. Phillips Chapter, Holy Royal Arch Masons, now I am Past High Priest.
4. Raised to the 32^c Degree in the Holy Selpuchre Consistory No17
5. Created a Noble into Syria Temple No.31 A.E.A.O.N.M.S.
6. Joined and became a Faculty member of Berklee College of Music
7. Appointed Grand Organist of all Houses in the Prince Hall Family.
8. Joined Rising Sun Chapter O.E.S., now Past Patron.

In 1972, appointed Imperial Deputy Director of Talent and Scholarship Pageant for the Imperial Council A.E.A.O.N.M.S. a position I still hold.

Appointed Musical Director of the Order of Pythagorans.

1974 Served as Worshipful Master of Celestial Lodge N^o.2, now Past Master.

1976 Appointed and served as District Deputy Grand Master of the First Masonic District.

1975 Elected and served as Vice President of the Piano Technicians Guild, Boston Chapter.

Became a member of Sara R. Hall Court, Heroines of Jericho. now Past Worthy Joshua.

Accepted as a member of the Professional Musicians Club, Boston, Mass.

1978 Elected and served as Grand Associate Patron of the Grand Chapter Order of the Eastern Stars, Jurisdiction of Massachusetts

In December, 1979 Elected Worthy Grand Patron of the Grand Chapter, Order of the Eastern Stars, Jurisdiction of Mass.

In May 1980 was elevated to the 33rd and last Degree by the United Supreme Council, Ancient and Accepted Scottish Rite of Freemasonry, Northern Jurisdiction.
