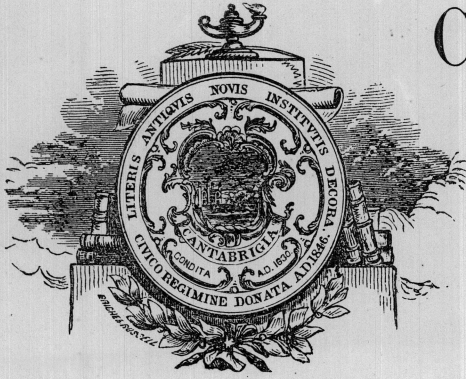




CITY OF CAMBRIDGE.

IN BOARD OF ALDERMEN,

May 29, 1873.

WHEREAS: It is adjudged by this Board that the public necessity and convenience require that

Cogswell Avenue

should be laid out as a public Street. Ordered that a strip of land *forty feet* in width between

North Avenue and the Fitchburg Railroad,

included between the *red* lines as shown on a plan drawn by

Barbour & Hodges dated April 19, 1873,

and now before this Board, be taken for public use and laid out as a public Street.

Ordered that *no* damages be allowed for the land so taken as aforesaid, *and* that thirty days be allowed for the removal of all fences and other obstructions standing thereon,
