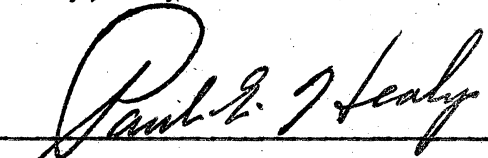

- WHEREAS: This City Council was shocked upon learning of the death of Middlesex County Sheriff Edward F. Henneberry, Jr., Sheriff of the largest county in the Commonwealth; and
- WHEREAS: Sheriff Henneberry graduated from Saint Columbkille's High School in 1952 and Boston College in 1959 and later attended Boston University Law School, taking time from his academic career to serve his country during the Korean Conflict from 1954 to 1956 as a member of the United States Army; and
- WHEREAS: Edward Henneberry was appointed as Deputy Sheriff in 1965 by the late Sheriff Howard W. Fitzpatrick and in 1974 he was named Chief Civil Deputy Sheriff for Middlesex, a position he held until he was elected Sheriff in 1980, taking office in January, 1981; and
- WHEREAS: Sheriff Henneberry was a recognized criminal justice expert, lecturing on the topic throughout the Commonwealth and has served as a Trustee of the Middlesex Community College in Bedford and was a member of the Advisory Board of Law and Justice of the University of Lowell; now therefore be it
- RESOLVED: That this City Council go on record extending its deepest sympathy to Mrs. Pauline Henneberry and to the entire Henneberry family at this time of such personal loss; and be it further
- RESOLVED: That the City Clerk be and hereby is requested to forward a suitably engrossed copy of this resolution to Mrs. Henneberry on behalf of the entire City Council.
