In Board of Aldermen, July 23rd 1862

Ordered

That the consent in writing of this board be given to the Citizens Gas Light Company to dig up and open the grounds in any of the Streets lanes and highways of the City so far as is necessary to accomplish the object of the corporation - the same to be done under the direction of the Superintendent of Streets.

Provided the Citizens Gas Light Company obligate themselves with suitable penalties and securities to furnish such citizens as have premises on the line of their pipes and desire it an illuminating gas, two feet of which shall be equal in illuminating power to five feet of the gas now furnished to the Citizens by the Cambridge Gas Light Company - and also provided that the price to be charged to the citizens for the gas furnished to them by the new company shall not exceed Two Dollars and Fifty cents per thousand feet and to the city at two thirds of a cent per hour for street lamps
