To the Honorable, the City Council:

In response to Awaiting Report #6 regarding the status of discussions between the Congressional Subcommittee on Postal Personnel and Modernization and the U.S. Postal Service, the following is the information:

The Congressional Subcommittee held a hearing in the Sullivan Chambers on July 22, 1991 and heard testimony regarding service delivery in the City Cambridge, the organization of the Cambridge Post Office, and the siting of the proposed Northwest Mail Processing Center in Waltham, near the Cambridge water shed. Congressmen Hayes, McClouskey and Kennedy took testimony from Councillors Russell and Duehay, Mayor Wolf and Mayor Stanley of Waltham, as well as from residents of Cambridge and representatives from the postal unions and management.

At the conclusion of the hearing, the Subcommittee recommended the suspension of the administrative office status of Cambridge postal facilities pending discussions between the unions and management, mediated by Congressman Joseph Kennedy. This group will report back to the Subcommittee with recommendations to ultimately improve service delivery in Cambridge. The Subcommittee also recommended that the Government Accounting Office look at the site selection process used for the proposed facility in Waltham.
