
Dear Ms. Shorey:

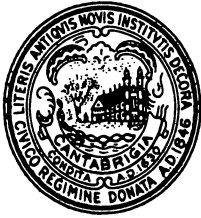
