First female voter

Mary T. Horan of Cambridge died July 12 at the Cambridge Nursing Home. She was 102.

Horan was born in Cambridge May 27, 1896. She had been a telephone operator for New England Telephone for 46 years, and a late member of the Telephone Pioneers of America for 39 years. Horan also held the distinction of being the first woman in Cambridge to vote.

She was the aunt of John "Jack" White of Cambridge, Clare Tallon
