In Board of Aldermen, Aug. 30 1865

The Committee on Ordinances to whom was referred an Order relative to changing the Ordinances so as to give the Committee on Roads and Bridges of the Board of Aldermen the direction of the Superintendent of Streets have considered the same and

Report;

The larger part of the duties of the Committee on Roads and Bridges of the Board of Aldermen are performed by them really as a Committee of said Board as Jurseymen of Highways and your Committee think that a Committee of the Board of Jurseymen of Highways should actually be appointed. It has been the custom for a series of years to choose the Mayor and Aldermen Jurseymen of Highways, and frequently if not usually no distinction has been made, whether they were acting in the capacity of one board or the other. In the general care and management of streets and bridges the Superintendent is by ordinance, under the control and direction of the Jurseymen of Highways, and it seems desirable, that in a subordinate degree at least, he should be under the direction of a Committee of said Board. Your Committee therefore recommend the passage of the accompanying ordinance.
