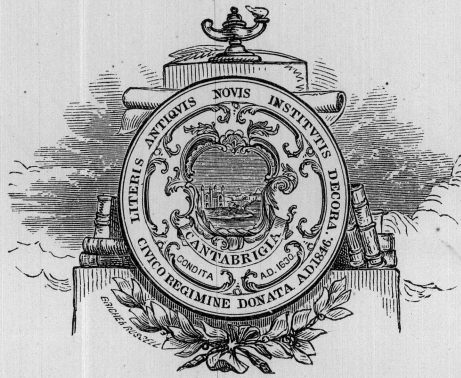


CITY OF CAMBRIDGE.



In Board of Aldermen, *Sept. 10, 1873*

Resolved, That the public convenience and necessity require that

*Austin Street
Should be widened
near its junction with Main Street*

by taking for this purpose certain parcels of land, as shown on a plan prepared by the City Engineer, and now before this Board.

Therefore, Ordered, that so much of the land on *the southerly side of
Austin Street,
(including land at the junction of said
Austin St. and Main St.)*
as is included between the *red* lines shown on a plan of *Austin*
Street, drawn by the City Engineer, dated *Oct. 29, 1872*, and now before this
Board, be taken for public use, and laid out as a public way and a part of said *Austin*
Street.

Ordered, That damages occasioned by said *widening* be estimated
and awarded as follows :

To Daniel A. Buckley \$500.00

Ordered, That *three months*, be allowed to the persons whose land is
taken for said *widening* for the removal of *buildings &c*, standing
on the land so taken as aforesaid.

Seven days for concurrence.
