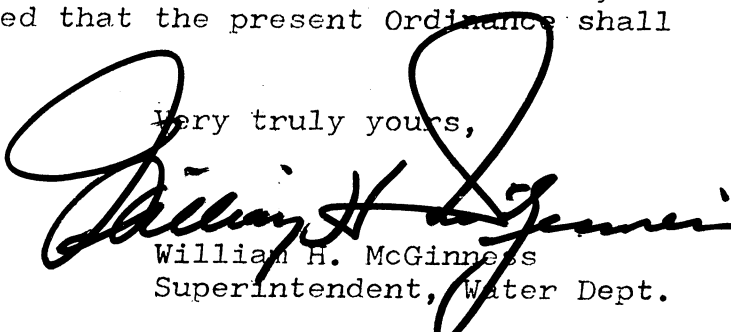
Subject Fishing - Cambridge Water Reservoirs

Regarding your request for a report concerning the advisability of fishing in the Cambridge Water Reservoirs, I wish to advise you as follows. The City Ordinances Chapter 36, Section 25 is as follows, "No person shall fish, or swim, or bathe -- -- in Fresh Pond, Stony Brook, or Hobbs Brook, or other reservoir of the water works."

There have been many previous requests and Council orders similar to this and meetings have been held with officials of the State Health Dept. and in every instance it was found that in the best interest of the City, the water works, and public health and safety that the provisions of the City Ordinance should be maintained.

The Water Board has also made investigations at numerous times concerning this matter and in every instance has decided that the present Ordinance shall be maintained.

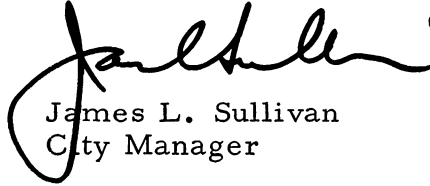
