MAYOR WOLF

- WHEREAS: The Caspar Shelter for alcoholics is an absolutely essential facility for Cambridge; and
- WHEREAS: The temporary shelter is falling apart and funds, \$2.5 million, for a permanent shelter have been appropriated by the State Executive Office of Community Development; and
- WHEREAS: Now, because of the State fiscal crisis, the State is threatening to withdraw these funds; therefore it is
- ORDERED: That the City Clerk immediately send a letter to his Excellency the Governor, and Amy Anthony, Secretary of Executive Office of Community Development, requesting continued funding of the CASPAR Shelter for alcoholics, along with this order; and be it further
- ORDERED: That a copy of the letter and order be sent to each member of our state legislative delegation; and be it further
- ORDERED: That a copy of this order be sent to the President of MIT and MIT's Director of Community Relations reminding them of the urgency in working with the City to solve the siting problem for the CASPAR facility.
