Russell, a City of Cambridge employee, if elected as a representative of the Cambridge Taxicab Advisory Committee, would be forced to decline to serve in that position due to rumored harassment and interdepartmental embarrassment of him emanating from the office of the License Commission, which harassment and embarrassment could effect his status and continued employment in the Department of Public Works; and
- WHEREAS: It is essential that these allegations be tracked down thoroughly, be proven valid or invalid, true or false and that all issues aligned thereto be clarified for appropriate discussion and response by this City Council; now therefore be it
- RESOLVED: That the City Manager be and hereby is requested to direct the License Commissioner to provide this City Council with a complete written report on this matter no later than October 30, 1989.
