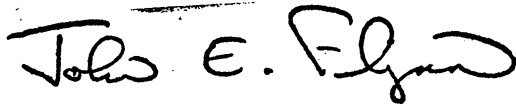
JANUARY 29, 1990

- WHEREAS: The safety of all Cambridge citizens is of the highest concern to all; and
- WHEREAS: This Councillor has worked for many years with residents in the Washington Elms/Newtowne Court neighborhood; and
- WHEREAS: The difficulties within the development seem to be very difficult in spite of excellent efforts by the Police Department;
- WHEREAS: Many concerns and fears are expressed by residents of the development with regard to safety and security; and
- WHEREAS: This past week there was an incident where a Cambridge youngster was killed in a stabbing incident by out of town residents; now therefore be it
- RESOLVED: That the City Manager be and hereby is requested to confer with the Cambridge Police Department to consider designating Washington Elms/Newtowne Court as a high priority area for police coverage with increased police controls as well as providing this City Council with a report detailing all relevant incidents involving Cambridge and Boston residents; and be it further
- RESOLVED: That city officials, including city administration, all relevant human services professionals, and the Area 4 Crime Task Force police officers be requested to meet with residents of the neighborhood to help instill a sense of security with this development for as long as needed; and be it further
- RESOLVED: That the City Manager be requested to contact the Executive Director of the C.H.A. to discuss any possible collaborative efforts; and be it further
- RESOLVED: That the City Manager be and hereby is requested to confer with the City Electrician and other appropriate City personnel with the view in mind of studying the street lighting in Area Four and make all necessary changes to said lighting to increase the wattage and increase the security of area residents; and be it further
- RESOLVED: That the City Council go on record expressing its sorrow to the families of the victims of this most recent incident.
