September 14, 1981

- WHEREAS: The severe cutbacks in programs by the Reagan Administration and the Congress has levied great economic hardships on workers and the communities in which they reside, such as Cambridge; and
- WHEREAS: Job protection for workers, such as OSHA, are being dismantled, and affirmative action is being undermined by the current Administration; and
- WHEREAS: Federal aid to the cities and towns in the form of block grants is being cutback; and
- WHEREAS: Young people in Cambridge and throughout the country, especially minority youth, are bearing the brunt of these hardships such as severe unemployment and lack of educational opportunities; therefore be it
- RESOLVED: That the Cambridge City Council
1. Endorse the September 19 SOLIDARITY DAY march in Washington, D.C. initiated by the A.F.L.-C.I.O. and endorsed by over 200 national labor, civil rights, and community organizations including the N.A.A.C.P., the National Council of Churches, and the United States Student Association.
 2. Call upon the federal government to stop balancing the budget at the expense of the poor and working people.
