To the Honorable, the City Council:

I am hereby requesting the appropriation of a grant from the Department of Housing and Community Development for \$10,635 to the Grant Fund Human Services Salaries and Wages account (\$550) and Other Ordinary Maintenance account (\$10,085) to provide funds for the Low Income Sewer and Water Assistance Program (LISAWAP) that is available to Cambridge and Somerville homeowners whose income falls at or below 150% of poverty according to federal guidelines. Eligible clients can receive 25% or \$200, whichever is less, toward their annual water and sewer bill over \$115. The Salaries and Wages portion of this appropriation will cover a share of the salaries of the staff of the Fuel Assistance / LISAWAP Program.
