In the year One Thousand
Eight Hundred and Seventy-nine.

An Ordinance
in relation to Shades and Awnings.

Be it ordained by the City Council
of the City of Cambridge, as follows:

Section 1. No canopy, awning, shade, shade-
frame or shade curtain shall hereafter be
erected or maintained within the limits of any
street without permission of the Board of Mayor
and Aldermen.

Section 2. Any person violating this ordinance
shall be liable to a fine of not exceeding
Twenty Dollars.

Section 3. The ordinance in relation to shades
and awnings, approved Jan. 1. 1879, is hereby
repealed.

curtain" in the second line of the 7th section,
the words - Unless constructed of cloth or
canvas attached to an iron frame securely
fastened and supported from above, and not
less than eight feet above the level of the
sidewalk over which it is placed.
