COUNCILLOR RUSSELL

WHEREAS: Two rabid racoons have been caught in Belmont, not far from the Cambridge line; and

WHEREAS: These racoons pose a threat, not only to pets but also to human beings; and

WHEREAS: Governor Weld has signed legislation, (House Bill #5610) which requires that in addition to dogs, that pet cats be vaccinated for rabies before they reach the age of six months;

WHEREAS: This bill will go into effect February 23, 1993; now therefore be it

RESOLVED: That this City Council go on record as urging citizens of Cambridge to use caution when confronted by any racoon, or other wildlife, and to be sure that all cats and dogs are vaccinated, and where possible, to keep pets indoors, or allowed outside only under the supervision of the owners.
