Subject City Council Order #23 of Jan. 29, 1979 - Rescinding previous order exempting vehicles with Resident Stickers from the 24 hour parking limit regulation

I have met with the City Solicitor concerning this Council Order and it was agreed that any change in this Traffic Regulation would have to be made by the Traffic Director. I have requested from the State Department of Public Works legal section, a ruling on whether this type of a regulation would be legal or if there would be a conflict with the existing state statute that allows the Commissioner of Public Works to declare, any motor vehicle abandoned, that has been parked on a public way for a period of 72 hours or more. Any vehicle declared to be abandoned can then be towed and disposed of in accordance with state laws.

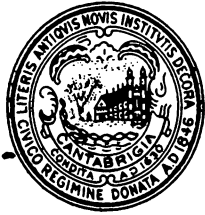

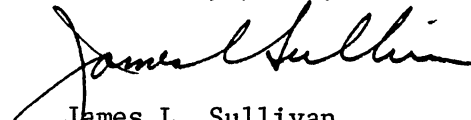
