VICE MAYOR REEVES

WHEREAS: The solution to war is peace; and

WHEREAS: The war with Iraq is of great concern to all Cambridge residents and will have a profound impact on the lives of many area families, especially those whose members are currently serving with the United States military in that region; and

WHEREAS: It is of vital importance that all American participate in a dialogue that leads toward achieving peace in the world; and

WHEREAS: Community activist, Andrew P. Jones, who has numerous ties to Cambridge as a journalist, musician, and Emmy Award winning videographer, was a member of the Gulf Peace Team Camp, and international group of peace activists from Europe and the United States; and

WHEREAS: Mr. Jones spent twelve days at the Camp in Iraq, from January 15, 1991 to January 27, 1991, as part of the Gulf Peace Team's campaign against the onset of this tragic conflict; and

WHEREAS: Mr. Jones was the only African American and the only Massachusetts resident at this unique place and time in history, risking his life to make a statement for peace; now therefore be it

RESOLVED: That the City Council go on record acknowledging the contributions of Andrew Jones, and others around the world, whose statements of conscience serve to encourage reasonable debate and reinforce our moral strength in difficult times.
