IN BOARD OF ALDERMEN, Oct. 1, 1889.

ORDERED, That due notice be given to the persons herein-after named that they are maintaining encroachments upon the public streets in front of their respective estates, and that they be directed to remove said encroachments on or before the fifteenth day of October current. In default thereof the Superintendent of Streets is hereby directed, forthwith, to remove the aforesaid obstructions at the expense of the owners of abutting lands. Viz :

JANE E. COWAN, east side of Webster avenue, near Plymouth street. Front steps and fence posts encroach from twenty to twenty-four inches.

MRS. ISABELLA JAMES, west side of Hawthorn street, corner of Brattle street. Fence encroaches from three to thirteen inches.

GEORGE STEVENS, north side of Otis street, between Fifth and Sixth streets. Building, corner of Fifth street, encroaches from six to seven inches.

JAMES MINCHIN, Otis street. Fence to lot next west of Otis Schoolhouse lot encroaches eleven to thirteen inches.

To the Honorable Board of Mayor and Aldermen
Gentlemen

By Sec. 3 - Chap. 3 of the Ordinances of the City of Cambridge, it becomes the duty of the City Engineer "whenever he ascertains that any structure has been placed in violation of this chapter"; that is, in placing said structure outside the corner line of any street or way, - "he shall at once give notice to the Mayor and Aldermen, in writing, of such violation" These such violations have come to my attention -

1. East side of Webster Ave. near Plymouth St.
Iron steps and fence posts encroach from 20" to 24"
Estate owned by Jane E. Cowan
2. Hawthorn St. West side cor. of Brattle St.
Fence encroaches 3" to 13"
Estate owned by Mrs. Isabella James

3^d Otis Street North side between Fifth
and Sixth Street -

Building on Fifth encroaches 6" to 7"

Owned by George Stevens -

Line to lot next West of Otis school lot
encroaches 11" to 13" -

Lot owned by James Minchin -

Also steps to building cor. Sixth Street
encroaches about 11" -

Building owned by Heirs of Bela N. Bartlett -

The first two cases cited are of
comparatively recent construction, while the
encroachments referred to in the 3^d case
have been in position for many years -
