- WHEREAS: Joe served his country well during World War II as a member of the United States Army Air Force and upon his honorable discharge in 1946 he held various jobs, pending appointment to the Department which he loved and which has been served so well by his father and brother who succeeded him and now by his son Richard, who currently is in the Police Academy; and
- WHEREAS: Joe served his city with distinction and the people who made his acquaintance throughout the years will miss his friendliness, charm and old Irish wit; now therefore be it
- RESOLVED: That this City Council go on record extending its deepest sympathy to Mrs. Ann Linehan and the entire Linehan family at this time of such personal sorrow; and be it further
