

City of Cambridge.

In the year One Thousand Eight Hundred
and Seventy-Seven.

An Ordinance in relation to the Fees of
City Officers.

Be it ordained by the City Council of
the City of Cambridge, as follows.

Sect. 1.

All fees and perquisites received
by the City Clerk, and City Solicitor for any
duties performed by either of them in his
official capacity, shall be paid monthly
into the City Treasury; and the salaries
of said officers, as fixed by ordinance, shall
be in full for all services rendered in con-
nection with their respective offices.

Sect. 2.

All fees, charges and commissions
of every kind and description allowed by
law for the collection of taxes, betterments,
rates and assessments of every kind, to the
City Treasurer and Collector, shall be col-
lected and so paid by said City Treasurer
and Collector into the City Treasury, and
shall become the property of the City.

Act. 3.

All fees, penalties, witness fees, moneys or compensation received by the Chief of Police, or any member of the Police force, other than the salary fixed by ordinance, for any services rendered by them in their official capacity, except moneys or compensation received by them for special services, and except witness fees for testimony in courts without the limits of the City, shall be paid monthly into the City Treasury by the officer receiving the same, and the salary so paid by ordinance shall be in full for all services rendered by the Chief of Police, or any member of the Police force, during their respective terms of office.

Act. 4.

The City Clerk, Treasurer ^{and} Collector, and City Solicitor shall annually, on the 30th of November, make return to the City Council of a detailed statement of all fees and perquisites received by each of them for the year ending with that date; And the Chief of Police shall make a similar return of the fees and perquisites received by himself and each member of the Police force.

Act. 5.

All ordinances and parts of ordinances inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed.

Sect. 6. This ordinance shall go into effect
in the first Monday of January next.
