WHEREAS:-

The Comprehensive City Demonstration Program for the First Action Year (herein referred to as the "Comprehensive Program") for the Model Neighborhood of the City of Cambridge was approved by resolution adopted May 5, 1969; and

WHEREAS:-

A grant agreement with the United States of America was executed on August 1, 1969 providing for Federal financial assistance under Title I of the Demonstration Cities and Metropolitan Development Act of 1966; and

WHEREAS:-

The submission to the Secretary of Housing and Urban Development (herein called the "Secretary") of a proposed Second Year Action Program, amending the said Comprehensive Program, was authorized by resolution adopted May 27, 1970; and

WHEREAS:-

The submission to the Secretary of a Proposed Third Year Action Program, amending the said Comprehensive Program, was authorized by resolution adopted August 16, 1971; and

WHEREAS:-

The submission to the Secretary of a proposed Fourth Year Action Program, amending the said Comprehensive Program, was authorized by resolution adopted October 16, 1972; and

WHEREAS:-

The submission to the Secretary of a Proposed Transitional Budget amending the Fourth Year Action Program, and extending the same, as well as further amending the said Comprehensive Program, was authorized by resolution adopted April 8, 1974; and

WHEREAS:-

The U. S. Office of Housing and Urban Development has tendered the City Manager an offer of additional funds to be utilized at local option to finalize the Model Cities Program; and

WHEREAS:-

The Model Cities Board at the request of City Council, and in light of the then potential availability of additional Transitional Program monies, revised its budget allocations for the use of Fourth Year Transitional monies and thereby reduced required amounts for the completion of scheduled Capital Projects; and

WHEREAS:-

The Model Cities Board with the concurrence of the City Manager is desirous of expediting the timely completion of outstanding project obligations and also the continuation and/or reinstitution of certain component activities in a manner corresponding to the objectives of the Comprehensive Plan as amended; and

WHEREAS:-

It is the expressed intention of the City Manager to recommend the local obligation of the offered U. S. Department of Housing and Urban Development monies so that they will not revert to the general fund being made available to other Model Cities Programs in the New England Region, thereby maximizing the possibility of further funding of the local program by means of the same general fund in the event other Model Cities forfeit or are unable to obligate monies offered; and

WHEREAS:-

The specific budget allocation of new monies will be finalized by the City Manager in consultation with, and on the advice of the Model Cities Board; and

WHEREAS:-

The Secretary has approved the First, Second, Third, Fourth Year Action, and Fourth Year Transitional Programs and will render a revised budget grant providing for an additional grant and said budget will be accepted by the City Manager; and

WHEREAS:-

The necessary approvals for the submission of a Transitional Program budget will be secured in a manner generally corresponding to the provisions of an Executive Order dated June 14, 1971 which mandated a reorganization plan for the City Demonstration Agency of the City of Cambridge;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF CAMBRIDGE THAT:-

Sec. 1 The City Council of Cambridge hereby authorizes the City Manager to apply to the U. S. Office of Housing and Urban Development for the total \$503,000 being offered from fiscal 1974 monies already appropriated and from fiscal 1975 funds anticipated in the immediate future, and further authorizes that a plan for utilization of these monies, consistent with the overall Comprehensive Plan, shall be a matter for resolution between the City Manager and the Model Cities Board and shall not be subject to further City Council approval so as to maximize Cambridge's eligibility for additional Model Cities monies which may be made available due to under-spending of other programs in the New England Region.

Sec. 2 The City Council of Cambridge assumes full responsibility for assuring that all grant funds will be used in an economical and efficient manner in carrying out the Comprehensive Program, as amended to date and as will be amended as provided above in Section 1, and assures that necessary non-Federal share of the cost of Program Administration.

Sec. 3 The City Manager is authorized to do all things necessary to carry out the Comprehensive Program, as amended to date and as will be amended as in Section 1, including the submission of such reports, certifications, and other material as the Secretary shall require, and the approval from time to time of revisions in the grant budget, including revisions which increase the total Federal grant and the necessary non-Federal share of the cost of Program Administration, provided that any additional required local matching share can be met by contributions of allowable cost items (cash equivalent services, equipment, etc.), which will not necessitate additional cash appropriations.

Sec. 4 The City Treasurer or his successor or delegate may do all things required to be done in order to obtain payment of the grant, including but not limited to the selection of a commercial bank to receive payment vouchers, the submission of signature specimens, and the filing of requests for payment.

Sec. 5. The City Council hereby authorizes acceptance by the City of Cambridge of any Model Cities monies resulting from its resolves as delineated above.

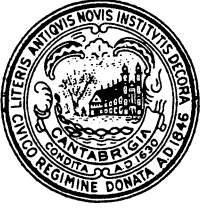
