Gustave M. Solomons


On the first ballot, to determine the Committee's first choice, the results were as follows:

On the next two ballots, to determine the Committee's second and third choices, Mr. Solomons and Mrs. Serino, respectively, received the most votes.

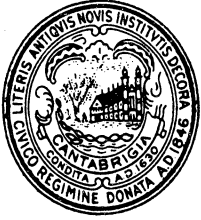
The Committee submits to you for your consideration as Election Commissioner, the names of Messrs. Samp and Solomons and Mrs. Serino, in that order.
