- WHEREAS:** Mr. O'Keefe joined the School Department in 1953 as a teacher at the Peabody School where he began a career of distinction, not only as a teacher, but also as a school administrator, and
- WHEREAS:** Mr. O'Keefe was the first Master of the Lincoln School where he established many administrative procedures which enabled the faculty and staff to function in an efficient manner, and
- WHEREAS:** While serving as Master of the Harrington School, Mr. O'Keefe was chosen by the Superintendent of Schools to be acting Assistant Superintendent for Elementary Education, a position he held for quite some time until he returned to the people he truly loved, the children, faculty and staff of the Harrington School, and
- WHEREAS:** Mr. O'Keefe received both his Bachelor's and Master's Degrees from Boston College as well as having received a certificate in advanced studies from Harvard Graduate School of Education, now therefore be it
