- WHEREAS: R. Buckminster Fuller is a son of Massachusetts, having been born in Milton on July 12, 1895, and having attended Milton Academy and Harvard College, and
- WHEREAS: R. Buckminster Fuller is the great-grandson of Timothy Fuller, Massachusetts State Senator from 1835-41, and
- WHEREAS: R. Buckminster Fuller is the grand-nephew of Margaret Fuller, the philosopher and leader of the Boston Transcendentalist Movement of the 1840's, whose birthplace stands today as the Margaret Fuller-Neighborhood House, a community service center in Cambridge, and
- WHEREAS: R. Buckminster Fuller is a comprehensive designer, inventor, engineer, mathematician, architect, cartographer, philosopher, and poet, and
- WHEREAS: R. Buckminster Fuller is the recipient of 39 honorary doctorate degrees, 30 national and international awards, the author of 17 books and 25 major articles, the subject 5 books, and has lectured at more than 400 educational institutions around the world, and
- WHEREAS: R. Buckminster Fuller is well known for being the inventor of the geodesic dome, a revolutionary concept in building construction, of which 100,000 have been built around the world;
- WHEREAS: R. Buckminster Fuller has, since 1927, committed his life to the service of all humanity; now therefore be it
- RESOLVED: That I, Alfred E. Vellucci, as Mayor of the City of Cambridge, do hereby proclaim Friday, February 11, 1976 as R. Buckminster Fuller Day in the City of Cambridge to acknowledge and honor his 50 years of creativity, vitality and service to mankind.
