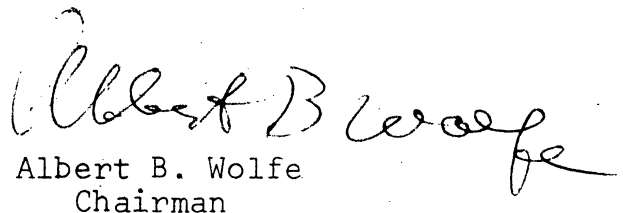

To the owners of property in the vicinity of 151 Brattle Street in the Fayerweather-Lee Historic District:

Our Commission has received an application from Anthony T. Enders, owner of 151 Brattle Street, for an application for a certificate of appropriateness to paint the shingles and brick of the house a medium brown (Olympic Stain "Cocoa") and the wood trim an off-white (white mixed with brown stain or paint), and to erect a fence and gate 6 feet high which would be 75 feet from the street, therefore only slightly visible from the public way.

Under the Historic Districts Act (G.L. Chapter 40C, as amended by Acts of 1971, Chapter 359) we may dispense with public hearing if we deem the features involved insubstantial in effect on the District and if we give 10 days prior notice to owners of property adjoining and which we deem materially affected.

Please notify us of any objection to our issuing the requested certificate after a lapse of 10 days.
