IN CITY COUNCIL

WHEREAS:-

The Comprehensive City Demonstration Program for the First Action Year (herein referred to as the "Comprehensive Program") for the model neighborhood of the City of Cambridge was approved by resolution adopted May 5, 1969; and

WHEREAS:-

A grant agreement with the United States of America was executed on August 1, 1969 providing for Federal financial assistance under Title I of the Demonstration Cities and Metropolitan Development Act of 1966; and

WHEREAS:-

The submission to the Secretary of Housing and Urban Development (herein called the "Secretary") of a proposed Second Year Action Program, amending the said Comprehensive Program, was authorized by resolution adopted May 27, 1970; and

WHEREAS:-

The submission to the Secretary of a proposed Third Year Action Program, amending the said Comprehensive Program, was authorized by resolution adopted August 16, 1971; and

WHEREAS:-

The Secretary has approved the First, Second, and Third Year Action Programs and has rendered a revised budget grant providing for an additional grant and said budget has been accepted by the City Manager; and

WHEREAS:-

A transfer of Second Action Year funds authorized by an Order of the Cambridge City Council on October 28, 1971 requires continuation to effectuate completion of certain Model Cities projects; and

WHEREAS:-

Upon recommendation of the CDA Planning Councils (established in response to an Executive Order dated June 14, 1971 which mandated a reorganization plan for the City Demonstration Agency of the City of Cambridge) and the CDA, Executive Committee, the CDA Board of Directors at its regular meeting of June 7, 1972, unanimously voted to request an extension of the Third Action Year Program

Until December 31, 1972 so as to provide for a fiscal year concurrent with that of the City of Cambridge and furthermore to provide for informed citizen involvement in Fourth Action Year planning processes; and

WHEREAS:-

The extension of the Third Action Year by an additional two months will require a Transfer of Funds within the projects in the Model Cities Program;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the City Council of Cambridge that:

Sec. 1 That the Transfer of Second Action Year Funds authorized by the City Council on October 28, 1971 be continued.

Sec. 2 That the City Council concurs in the recommendation of the CDA Board of Directors, which is supported by the Model Cities Administration, and grants an extension of the Third Action Year Program until December 31, 1972.

Sec. 3 That the Transfer of Funds (which is attached hereto and made a part hereof) within Projects in the Third Year Action Program of the Comprehensive Program necessary to effectuate a two-month Program extension, are approved by the City Council.


Sec. 4 The City Manager is authorized to do all things necessary to carry out the Comprehensive Program, as amended, including the submission of such reports, certifications, and other material as the Secretary shall require, and the approval from time to time of revisions in the grant budget, including revisions which increase the total Federal grant and the necessary non-Federal share of the cost of Program Administration, provided that any additional required local matching share can be met by contributions of allowable cost items (cash equivalent services, equipment, etc.), which will not necessitate additional cash appropriations.

Sec. 5 The City Treasurer or his successor or delegate may do all things required to be done in order to obtain payment of the grant, including but not limited to the selection of a commercial bank to receive payment vouchers, the submission of signature specimens, and the filing of requests for payment.

WHEREAS:-

The necessary approvals for the submission of a Fourth Action Year Program by General Ordinance 766 of the City of Cambridge have been secured in a manner corresponding to the provisions of an Executive Order dated June 14, 1971 which mandated a reorganization plan for the City Demonstration Agency of the City of Cambridge dated June 14, 1971;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the City Council of Cambridge that:

Sec. 1 The Fourth Year Action Program (which is attached hereto and made a part hereof) including the projects and activities set forth in the revised grant budget, is hereby approved and the Comprehensive Program is deemed amended hereby.

Sec. 2 The City Council of Cambridge assumes full responsibility for assuring that all grant funds will be used in an economical and efficient manner in carrying out the Comprehensive Program, as amended, and assures the necessary non-Federal share of the cost of Program Administration.



To the Honorable, the City Council:

I do hereby submit to you the required resolutions whereby your approval may be rendered to the Fourth Action Year Plan of the Cambridge Model Cities Program and certain other related activities.

This plan represents the first submission fully prepared under the reorganized status of the Model Cities Agency which was instituted by my office in consultation with the U. S. Department of Housing and Urban Development last year. This reorganization has retained the unique features of the program as provided for in General Ordinance 766 while, at the same time, has served to bring the agency more in line with other City departments, and thereby enhanced the management consistency essential to the effective coordination of local government efforts, especially as such relate to federal programs.

The plan was prepared by the Model Cities Administration working in close cooperation with the citizen participation component of the program, CDA, Inc. As such, the 6 Component Planning Councils of CDA, whose membership is comprised of 150 Model Neighborhood and greater Cambridge residents and professional resource persons, recommended to the Model Cities Board the priorities for the drafting of a final plan. It was a task that involved approximately 500 hours of Planning Council Meetings and 70 hours of Board deliberations.

Because of ample planning period you were thus able to be in receipt of the Fourth Action Year Plan in sufficient time to consider its contents in an unhurried fashion, a practice which has not been characteristic of prior submissions.

The following represents a precis of the intent of each of the two resolutions which will collectively actualize the content of the scope of activities contained in the plan.

Resolution 1 provides for a continuation of the Third Action Year of Model Cities until December 31, 1972 together with the required authorizations for reprogramming of necessary funds from both the Second and Third Action Year Programs. This resolution allows the fiscal year of the Model Cities Agency to be brought in line with that of the City.



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
