In Board of Aldermen, June 14. 1868

Ordered, Resolved, That the public convenience and necessity require that claim Street, a little South Eastern of Longlow Street, be widened upon the North Eastern side thereof, by taking four hundred and four square feet of land belonging to the Heirs of the late Thomas Cookidge and three hundred and thirty-two square feet of land belonging to John Livermore;

Therefore Ordered, That there be taken for public use and laid out as a part of claim Street, and a public way, so much of the lands of the persons above mentioned as lies South Western of the line hereafter adopted as the line to which all future improvements on claim Street shall conform, as the same is delineated on J. G. Chase's Plan of claim Street on file in the City Clerk's office.

Ordered, That damages for the land so
