Under the present organizational structure of the Cambridge Police Department, there exists ten (10) vacancies for promotion to the rank of Sergeant.

If the organizational structure recommended by IACP were to be adopted, there would exist twenty-five (25) vacancies in said rank.

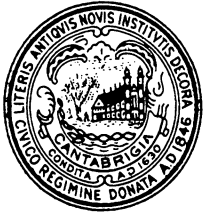
A suit has been instituted in the Federal District Courts which prohibits the certification, by Civil Service, of promotions from Patrolman to Sergeant.

Until such time as a court decision is rendered or an outside solution is reached, promotions to this rank must be withheld.
