- WHEREAS: November 11, 2000, 11:00 A.M., marks the 82nd anniversary of the armistice which ended the First World War, the tragic conflict in which 126,000 American and a total of more than 10 million soldiers from all nations involved lost their lives as the world was thrust in the era of modern warfare; and
- WHEREAS: Armistice Day officially received its name in 1926 through a Congressional Resolution, becoming a national holiday 12 years later and providing universal recognition for the conclusion of "the War to end all Wars"; and
- WHEREAS: Cambridge is proud to honor her fallen sons from World War I, Pvt. David J. Bordette, Cpl. Raymond J. Burns, Sgt. James J. Hurley, Lt. Bertram Williams, Pfc. Edward L. Zimmerman and others whose lives were cut short in the effort to make the world safe for democracy; and
- WHEREAS: In 1954 President Eisenhower officially proclaimed November 11th as Veterans' Day, acknowledging that peace was equally preserved by veterans of World War II and Korea; and
- WHEREAS: This year we are also commemorating the 50th Anniversary of the Korean War; and
- WHEREAS: Today we honor all American men and women who have served in all conflicts, paying tribute to their courage and the sacrifices they made while gratefully acknowledging the debt we owe them; now therefore be it
- RESOLVED: On this Veterans' Day, we let our veterans know that their service is not forgotten, that their sacrifices are appreciated, and that we salute our defenders, and we will never forget the men and women of past wars for whom there is still no accounting; and be it further
- RESOLVED: That this City Council go on record urging all residents to honor all men and women who have defended the country by celebrating Veterans Day on November 11, 2000.
