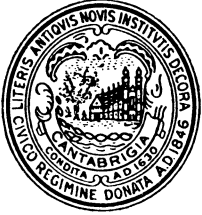
With regards to the attached order:- a Police officer (1st platoon) has been assigned week days, by Captain Brutti,

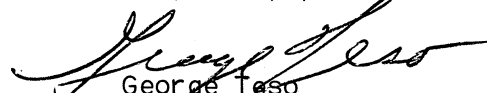
Dear Mr. Sullivan,

I am in the process of studying the intersection of Massachusetts Avenue and Beech Street with regards to the safety of school children crossing the intersection.

I cannot at this time install an exclusive pedestrian light at this intersection due to the fact that it would require the moving of two traffic control devices from one side of the street to the other and also the installation of some traffic signal conduit.

I am obtaining an estimated cost for this project and will as soon as possible make a report to you on this subject. In the meantime, I will work with the police department in trying to make this intersection safer.

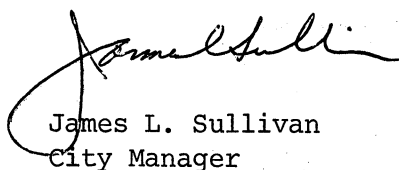
