AN ORDINANCE

In relation to the Fees of City Officers.

Be it ordained by the City Council of the City of Cambridge, as follows:

SECT. 1. All fees and perquisites received by the City Clerk, ~~City Treasurer and Collector of Taxes~~, and City Solicitor, for any duties performed by either of them in his official capacity, shall be paid monthly into the City Treasury; and the salaries of said officers, as fixed by ordinance, shall be in full for all services rendered in connection with their respective offices.

SECT. 2. All fees, penalties, witness fees, moneys or compensation received by the Chief of Police, or any member of the Police force, other than the salary fixed by ordinance, for any services rendered by them in their official capacity, except witness fees for testimony in courts without the limits of the city, shall be paid monthly into the City Treasury by the officer receiving the same, and the salary so paid by ordinance shall be in full for all services rendered by the Chief of Police, or any member of the Police force, during their respective terms of office.

SECT. 3. The City Clerk, Treasurer and Collector, and City Solicitor shall annually, on the 30th of November, make return to the City Council of a detailed statement of all fees and perquisites received by each of them for the year ending with that date. And the Chief of Police shall make a similar return of the fees and perquisites received by himself and each member of the Police force.

SECT. 4. All ordinances and parts of ordinances inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed.

SECT. 5. This ordinance shall go into effect on the first Monday of January next.

AN ORDINANCE

Establishing the Salary of the City Clerk.

Be it ordained by the City Council of the City of Cambridge, as follows:

SECT. 1. From and after the first Monday of January, in the year 1878, the salary of the City Clerk, in full for all services required of him by the charter and ordinances of the city, and the laws of the Commonwealth, shall be three thousand dollars each year.

SECT. 2. All ordinances and parts of ordinances inconsistent herewith, are hereby repealed.

AN ORDINANCE

Establishing the Office of Clerical Assistant to the City Clerk.

Be it ordained by the City Council of the City of Cambridge, as follows:

SECT. 1. At the commencement of each municipal year, and whenever a vacancy may occur, there shall be elected by a joint vote of the City Council, a Clerical Assistant to the City Clerk, who shall receive compensation for his services the annual salary of one thousand dollars. *He shall have no other office used the City Government.*

SECT. 2. The said Clerical Assistant shall render such service to the City Clerk as he may from time to time require in the performance of his duties, as established by the charter and ordinances of the city and the laws of the Commonwealth.

SECT. 3. Section 5 of Chapter 4, of the Revised Ordinances, and all ordinances amendatory thereof, providing for an allowance for clerical assistance to the City Clerk, are hereby repealed.

SECT. 4. This Ordinance shall go into effect on the first Monday in January next.
