COUNCILLOR DUEHAY

WHEREAS:

The moving of a day-care center operated by Harvard University from Palfrey House near Hammond Street to 58 Garfield Street would result in yet another residential building being supplanted by institutional use in the Agassiz Area; and

WHEREAS:

The neighbors on Garfield Street feel that Harvard must have a suitable alternative location which will cause less congestion; and

WHEREAS:

The City Council is concerned that the reported reason for the move from Palfrey House is an increase in the leakage of radiation from the nearby accelerator; therefore be it

RESOLVED:

That the City Manager be requested to order that the Commissioner of Health and Hospitals investigate the alleged radiation leakage and report his findings to the public and to the City Council immediately; be it further

RESOLVED:

That the City Council urge and that the City Manager be requested to urge Harvard University to seek a location more suitable than 58 Garfield Street for its day-care center if it must move.
